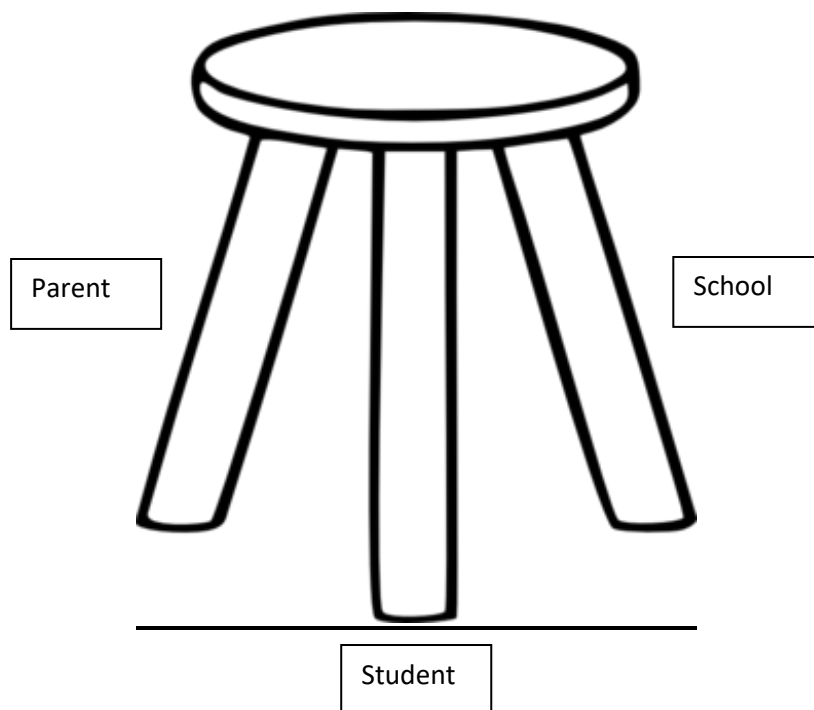




School Parent Partnership: Daily Admission



Like so many practices in School, success depends upon Parents, students and the school working together. We use the image of a 3 legged stool to describe this relationship. If one leg/support is removed, then the stool cannot remain standing.

As a result, we ask for your support for our daily admission policy:

Students **must attend** school or an alternative provision regularly, as set out in the ***Education Act 1996***

On a school night, please ensure the following:

- All media usage stops an hour before bedtime
- Bedtime is suitable-Teenagers require on average 8 hours of sleep a night



On a school day morning please ensure the following:

- Student is woken up in good time to prepare for the day ahead
- Student dresses in the correct uniform, with no loose jewellery
- Student is ready to be collected by their taxi (if applicable) 10 minutes before it is due
- Student is in a fit state to attend school. This means they are feeling well
- Student is not under the influence of any intoxicating substances
- Student is not carrying any item that can be perceived as a dangerous weapon



On arrival to school we will ensure:

- All students must be on the premises by 8.50am
- Students will be welcomed by The Care team who will assess them prior to entering the premises
- Any student who present signs that they have misused substances will be referred to the SLT
- Any item/s deemed unsuitable or that will interfere with their learning will be confiscated and the student will be referred to the SLT
- By **8.50** all students will be offered breakfast



A Student under the influence of any intoxicating substance such as alcohol or drugs

- will be refused entry and be seated in the foyer to await collection
- Parents/carers, the Police and MARAT will be informed
- Parents/carers will be requested to collect the student
- This is in line with ***Dfe Behaviour and Discipline in Schools Policy 2016, point 26:***

In all cases of misbehaviour the teacher can only discipline the pupil on school premises or elsewhere when the pupil is under the lawful control of the staff member.



A student will not be admitted if their mind set/behaviour:

- could compromise the effective provision of others in the school
- poses a threat to the health, safety and well-being of another pupil or member of staff
